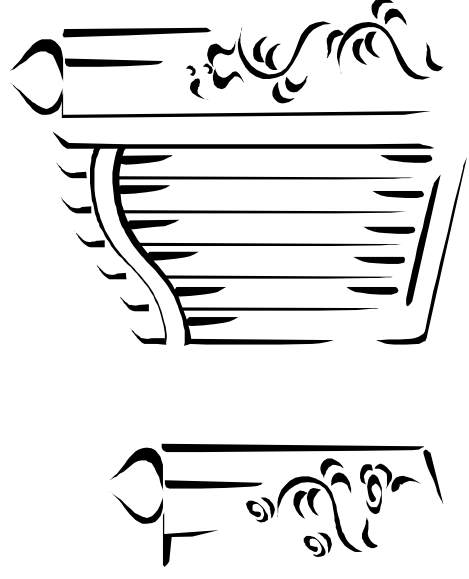
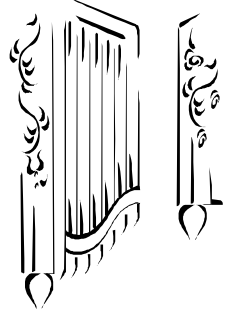

SI North Valley Garden Tour

June 11, 2011

Visit seven lovely private gardens in our area.

1 - This lovely country home features many garden rooms with keyhole views of the Rogue Valley, and a seven-pool cascading water feature. The property includes a multitude of woodland trees, shrubs, and flowers. Cleverly designed pine needle paths and a low maintenance/low water use design complete this family friendly garden.*

2 - Historic East Medford home with mature trees create a modern tranquil outdoor living space. See a rose garden, bulb garden, herbs, and lively annuals. Colorful shrubs, tall grasses, and flowers blend with walkways, trellises, and a waterfall to create a peaceful refuge.

3 - This English-style courtyard garden has been created by Adam Haynes of Artisan Landscapes of Jacksonville with a layout of French-style brick pathways inspiring contemplation, peace and quiet. The brick layout has a labyrinth feel to it, enhanced by the beautiful roses (etc.) This quaint retreat is set amongst expansive grounds under a mature tree canopy where you'll want to meander around the large stately home and pool.

4 - A lovely manicured garden surrounds this historic Jacksonville home. A feeling of calm will come over you as you enter the deeply shaded back garden, a gorgeous pink and green tri-color Beech shades the brick seating area, where you may enjoy a cool drink as you sit beside the trickling pond.

5- An open patio along the back of the home leads you alongside the base of a stream, to a small Rose Garden, bordered by paths that will take you to an Upper-Gazebo style patio , an informal Lower Flagstone Fire-pit area for relaxing, OR around the top of the stream and across the back of the yard to a wonderful SECRET GARDEN featuring a combination of herbs, vegetables and cut flowers."

6 -A tapestry of vivid color mixed with rusty treasures gives one a hint that an artist lives here. The front and side organic gardens mix perennials, annuals, fruits and vegetables with companion planting in mind. The backyard includes native and deer proof plants to blend with the incredible view of Mt. McLaughlin.

7 -This garden is an easy care woodland garden with meandering paths. When designing the garden she discovered that her dogs had created paths throughout the property, so they were included in the design. A stunning water feature is inhabited by both koi and goldfish of black, gold and mixed colors.*

***Two of these gardens are Soroptimist favorites from other tours that we feel are worth revisiting because of their low maintenance and energy efficient designs for even the busiest gardener.**
